The parish council continue to take the view that the dormer windows are incongruous, and the change of roof angle is not in keeping with the design and aesthetics of the buliding.

Highways / PPLO / Outdoor Space	 Recognising that SW&T and Somerset Wildlife Trust (SWT) are working together on a trial project to improve road verges, hedges and open spaces in their ownership, Churchstanton Parish Council resolves to work with them to; protect wildflower and wildlife habitats that already exist in this Community; agrees to improve the grass-cutting regimes of SW&T in the Parish to locally assist in this Trial and undertakes to consult with the Community to move this Project forwards to ensure, as SWT say, 'we can restore nature at scale and happens to be our best hope of storing carbon to mitigate against the effects of the global climate crisis.'
